Lest We Forget

Last summer when Doris and I were in California on vacation, we happened to be in a store in Modesto when I noticed an elderly gentleman using a walker. What caught my attention was the cap he was wearing; it was a cap frequently worn by veterans indicating branch of service and specific area of service. His cap indicated he had served with the Merchant Marine in WWII. Although not recognized as an official branch of our military, during times of war the Merchant Marine becomes an auxiliary of the Navy to transport troops and material. It was the Merchant Marine that manned the Liberty Ships which in convoys carried the necessary cargo to both the European and Pacific Theaters of war. The Merchant Marine also supplied our allies with food and other necessary supplies to continue the fight against the Axis powers.

The contribution and sacrifice of the Merchant Marine has not really been recognized. The war could not have been won without them, and the Mariners died at a rate of 1 in 24, which was the highest rate of casualties of any service. 733 American cargo ships were lost and 8,651 of the 215,000 who served perished in the war. Yet it wasn't until 1988 by order of a federal court that Merchant Mariners were granted veteran status. I walked over to this gentleman and thanked him for his service.

I have a personal interest in the Merchant Marine as my uncle, my mom's brother, served in the Merchant Marine in WWII. After Pearl Harbor, my uncle Al tried to enlist in the Navy, but he was rejected. He had polio when he was 10 and one leg was 5 inches shorter than the other. He served in the Merchant Marine for the duration of the war, surviving the loss of two of his ships.

I raise all of this to remind us that with much of the "Greatest Generation" now in their 80s and 90s, at least 500 veterans of WWII are dying every day. By the year 2036, the VA estimates that there will no longer be any living veterans from the conflict.

On Sunday, November 9, we will be honoring all our veterans, including some from WWII. I urge you to be part of this.
